Needs and Challenges

Need for monitoring at EU level of potential or confirmed medicines shortages to provide a EU answer to the issue through existing national mechanisms. Too often, patients are deprived from access to medicines in their home country while the product is fully available in other EU countries. When a shortage is being signalled because the patient can not access the product, it leaves very little time and alternative to put together a contingency plans.

Description of solutions proposed including (1) objectives, (2) outcomes, and (3) EU added value (i.e. how the action brings value at EU level, which is additional to the value that would have been otherwise created by Member State action alone)

The monitoring of shortages should be based on a early warning system for anticipated and existing shortages, involving all supply chain stakeholders, from manufacturers, full-service healthcare distributors (wholesale distribution authorisation holders), pharmacists to prescribers and the National Competent Authorities (NCAs). This structure should connect available national shortages monitoring systems which collect market signals from all supply chain stakeholders. Additionally, legislation should foresee the obligation of early notification of shortages by MAHs to full-service healthcare distributors (as well as to the NCAs), contributing to better stock management and supply.
